ZBT Update

This fall has been eventful fall in many ways for Zeta Beta Tau. Internationally, we are making more progress on leadership development, community relations, alumni engagement and growth than we ever have before. We're tackling important issues that are helping, and reminding, our brothers about how they can make an impact upon their school, upon their country and upon the Zeta Beta Tau Fraternity.

We continue to implement our annual plan to make significant progress toward our Brotherhood for a Lifetime Strategic Plan. The successes we have experienced over the first year of the Strategic Plan wouldn't have been possible without the hard work and dedication of our talented undergraduates, alumni and friends.

So far in Fall 2016, the Fraternity has initiated more than 1,100 new brothers, and our undergraduate total remains over 5,000. In November we offered the 2016 Israel Advocacy Summit to brothers from 16 chapters. We have hosted alumni events in Boston, Miami, Atlanta, Chicago and others in recent months.

An updated version of the ZBT online magazine, the Digital Deltan, has launched this month at www.zbtdigitaldeltan.com, and a refreshed version of our educational and networking online portal, COMPASS (the former iJOURNEY) debuted in October.

The Fraternity hosted a successful 2016 International Convention in July in Atlanta to kick off the year, wherein the Iota Chapter was named the 2016 Brummer Cup for Best Chapter recipient. We encourage all brothers to save the date for 2017 International Convention in Indianapolis from July 20 to 22, 2017.

Dr. Edward Porges



Ed Porges, '62, is now Dr. Edward Porges. As assistant professor at Washington State University back in the late 1970s, he was encouraged to begin a doctoral program. He enrolled at the University of Washington in Seattle in the College of Education, Department of Higher Education. He completed all his courses, the oral and written exams and was certified as an Ed.C., doctoral candidate in education. However, after assuming the department chair of hospitality management at Highline College, and four children later, the research dissertation component fell by the wayside.

Always lamenting that he was one merit badge shy of Eagle, and reaching his 75th birthday, he put the doctorate at the top on his bucket list. Despite the maximum 10-year completion time, he visited the dean of the University of Washington. He was enthusiastically welcomed back to complete his research project. Graduation was in June 2016, 36 years after he first enrolled. His educational history research is based upon his previously published papers. It is titled, *"Travel as Experiential Education in the 18th, 19th and 20th Centuries: The Grand Tour, World's Fairs, and Birthright Israel."*

The rest of the trip was full of visiting fun places; small fishing villages, exploring numerous marinas, being invited aboard other vessels, mandatory

cocktails in the cockpit, dinners on shore. Must say that Harvey made excellent breakfast gourmet onions and scrambled eggs on wheat toast and delicious afternoon cocktails. Alan was consistently updating and plotting a course ever mindful of tides and currents, fuel consumption, and NOAA weather forecasts on the VHF radio. And, I "masterfully" negotiated Challah Day on course and into dockage with now skilled linesmen.

Days later and back in Seattle, after dropping the guys off at the airport, my wife Phyllis asks, *"Didn't you guys get bored with one another after a week on the water?"* *"Heck no!"* I say... *"We reminisced, chatted, laughed, made decisions, shared duties, and looked forward to another future cruise."*



University of Denver's Holocaust Memorial Butterfly Garden

The brothers at the Zeta Beta Tau fraternity at the University recently installed a butterfly bush in the garden surrounding DU's Holocaust Memorial. The Iota Chapter was able to fund this project by a grant that was generously given to them from the Zeta Beta Tau Foundation. Before the installation there was a small ceremony. A representative of Hillel spoke along with Austin Oberfeld, the Heritage Chair for the chapter. Butterflies became a symbol of hope in repressive times after the Holocaust. Pavel Friedmann, a man who lost his life in a concentration camp, was found with a poem about a butterfly in his pocket that he had written and held on to it. The butterfly was his only sense of hope in the dim life of a concentration camp. The brothers from ZBT



at DU were proud to bring this to the DU community to help spread awareness and the need to end hate across the U.S. The bush will continue to grow and hopefully spread awareness through the DU community.
