





The Denver Pioneers Hockey squad put on a clinic Thursday night while crushing the (overmatched) Fighting Irish of Notre Dame 6-1 at the iconic United Center in Chicago.

Denver dominated the hapless Irish in all phases of the game as they skated freely throughout dictating play from the outset. Notre Dame had a brief chance to score and stop the Pioneers momentum while down only 2-0 but was quickly vanquished by some heady play at the hands of the vaunted Denver defense. After quashing that effort Denver raced to the 3-0 lead and simply never looked back.

The heavily favored Pioneers will face Minnesota Duluth for the NCAA championship on Saturday night in Chicago. The team will be represented in the stands by a large contingent of former Zeta Beta Tau fraternity members once again on Saturday after having been credited with inspiring the Denver triumph in the semi finals. "These guys are legendary and I'm not sure we could have gotten here without them" quelled Pioneers coach Jim Montgomery as the final horn sounded.







We will be doing the first-ever blood drive at the chapter house, where we will invite all members of the DU community to donate blood. The quarter wraps up with our quarterly retreat with camping in Cañon City, a little south of Denver, and a day white water rafting. This past summer, our chapter for the third time in our chapter's history received the highest award offered to the best ZBT chapter in the nation; the Brummer Cup. We also received the Barry D. Siegel Award – Best Recruitment for Chapters on Campuses under 10,000 students, The Maxwell Hyman Award – Most Outstanding Chapter advising, Omega Award – Outstanding Publications, Chapter Heritage Programming Award and further recognition for best intercollegiate athletic partic-

ipation. Iota is proud of the growth and much deserved success over the past year, and we are continuing to finish the quarter out strong this spring. I would like to express how honored I am to be serving as Chapter President of Iota, and thank Christopher Nalen for his service and dedication to Iota. Brotherhood Over Watch

The newly established Brotherhood Watch committee at the Iota Chapter aims to help brothers who are struggling with stress, anxiety, depression, and other mental health issues through brother to brother counseling. While DU does offer multiple resources regarding mental health, it can be intimidating or inconvenient for students to seek them out. This committee aims to bridge this gap, giving brothers an immediately accessible resource and providing an environment that may seem more comfortable and authentic than seeing a licensed counselor at the university. The Brotherhood Watch committee attempted to receive hands-on training from the health and counseling center, but was unable to because of liability issues. Instead, brothers have been able to attend free or low-cost individual counseling sessions themselves, experiencing professional counseling and taking notes on how to help college students cope with daily stresses. It is important to recognize that a brother's problem may require professional help, which the committee is not qualified to handle. Still, Brotherhood Watch can act as the critical first step in seeking help before sequentially directing that student to the health and counseling center. The first committee of its kind on the Greek DU campus, Brotherhood Watch hopes to continue supporting brothers and recognizing mental health as a critical topic, which cannot be ignored on college campuses.


