The on campus school year ended abruptly near the completion of winter quarter. The students finished up the quarter on line and are doing likewise for spring quarter. Our thanks go out to our graduating seniors who have helped the chapter reach new heights during their four years at DU. We wish them much success in their future endeavors.

IOTA Chapter is the most highly honored fraternity at DU ...winning three out of six FSL 2020 Chapter Awards including Excellent in Alumni & Advisor Engagement, Recruitment/Retention & Intake, Community Service and Cross Council Collaboration Award! Greg Grauberger was the recipient of Best Advisor .

The chapter completed winter quarter with 122 brothers. IOTA is the largest Greek organization at DU. It is unfortunate that we were unable to have spring recruitment and welcome more students to our brotherhood. On the academic front the chapter had a GPA of 3.42 winter quarter-above the all university average. We are extremely proud of their efforts in the classroom.

The chapter has raised OVER \$11,000 for the **Children's Miracle Network** this school year. Furthermore, brothers completed well over 1,000 hours of community service.

We thank Will Rader and his officers and chairmen for their efforts during their term in office and have high expectations for Alec Hurst and his team in the months to come.






## John 'Jack' Golbert 1940-2020 | Phi Sigma Delta, Iota '62

I recently received a note from Nate Davidovich '60, in Jerusalem. I am so saddened to learn of Jack Golbert's '62, passing. Nate and Jack lived in the same Jerusalem community. I just heard from Jack a few weeks ago. Of course, there was no mention of his heart issues. As college men, we shared many adventures: being first to move into the new chapter house, fraternity roommates, driving cross country for summer jobs at Bobbie Parker's Concord Hotel in the "Borscht Belt", having beers with him at his New York City apartment. Jack lived with his family in Aurora, Colorado. After graduation from DU, he moved to New York City to attend NYU law school. Several years later, he moved to Los Angeles and eventually back to Denver, his home town. In 1980, Jack moved to Israel, married and had a family. He had a law practice in Colorado and Jerusalem. Jack became a modern-orthodox Jew, was a prolific writer, a political activist and had a subtle sense of humor. He and his mother hosted my grandparents for a day at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs. My grandparents took several road trips from New Jersey to visit relatives in California. One year they stopped in Denver and the Golbert's invited them for a day of sight-seeing. I fondly knew the Golbert's, sister, parents, brothers and to this day, so admired Jack for his humor, intelligence and cultural devotion.

A couple years ago, my wife Phyllis and I traveled to Israel. We spent a wonderful day with the Davidovich and Golbert families. We had pizza, reminisced over the good times at the Iota Chapter house. (Our wives didn't get it.) Jack was so proud of his daughter serving in the Israeli military. He died at age 80, peacefully in his sleep, on Shabbat, as if he planned it that way. Thanks, Nate, for sharing this sad news. My condolences to Jack's brother, wife and children. 

Every year the Zeta Beta Tau Fraternity runs its **Get On The Ball** fundraiser. This fundraiser works to raise money for the Children's Miracle Network, a non-profit that raises funds for children's hospitals, medical research, and community awareness of children's health issues. Over the years the Iota chapter has raised thousands of dollars for the Children's Miracle Network and has recently established a wonderful relationship with the local Children's hospital in Aurora. This relationship has allowed brothers to visit the medical campus, interact with patients, and most importantly realize the incredible effect their fundraising efforts have on both the patients but their families and the staff that work tirelessly to ensure these children can lead a normal life. We hope that you will support us in this year's effort to raise money for Children's Miracle Network as any donation is greatly appreciated.

This year, we were able to raise \$11,192.38 for **Children's Miracle Network**, and we could not have done that without the support from our loyal friends, family, and most importantly, alumni! Thank You!

As the world's first Jewish Fraternity, Zeta Beta Tau remains in the unique position to serve as a convener on college campuses to address one of the deepest issues facing our brothers and their peers today: anti-Semitism and hate. Anti-Semitism can be defined as the mistreatment and discrimination of the Jewish people.

ZBT strives to help brothers understand the realities of anti-Semitism and guide them to become influencers in their community in the fight to eradicate anti-Semitism and other forms of hate. Our Hate Against One is Hate Against All campaign strives to end hate, whether it be anti-Semitism, racism or other forms of hate. ZBT believes that hate unchecked against one community can lead to hate against other communities. Hate has no place in our world, and ZBT seeks to create a more inclusive world through this multifaceted endeavor.

The Fraternity currently partners with two entities which share ZBT's passion to combat hate, the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) and the National Coalition Building Institute (NCBI). When collaborating with the ADL, ZBT brings their Words to Action workshop to chapters. Words to Action is a personalized program which discusses anti-Semitism, participants' own experiences with this form of hate, and how to respond to this type of discrimination. Approximately 20 chapters receive this workshop annually, thanks to the commitment and generous support of this effort by the Zeta Beta Tau Foundation. As Brother Matthew D. Rupe, Gamma Chi (University of South Florida) 2022 said after his Chapter concluded their Words to Action workshop, *"the session was very informative on anti-Semitism as a whole and was very helpful in providing ways of combating and preventing the further spread of anti-Semitism."* Following a chapter's participation in a Words to Action workshop, brothers coordinate a post-workshop impact program to implement the workshop's skills and techniques to educate non-ZBT brothers about hate. Omicron Chapter at Tufts University welcomed a local Holocaust survivor to share his story with the broader campus community. Over 90 students came to hear Dr. Ludwik Szymanski talk about his experience. Omicron Chapter President Omar M. Badr (2021) said *"Dr. Szymanski shared a powerful story about survival and moving forward, as well as speaking against hate and bigotry."*

ZBT values the diversity of its brothers, and to address other forms of hate which may be relevant to

brothers of various backgrounds, the Fraternity entered a partnership with NCBI. In July 2019, nearly 20 undergraduate and alumni brothers and staff were trained by NCBI professionals to be facilitators of diversity, equity, and inclusion workshops. This cohort of trained individuals lead workshops within their chapters as well as other chapters in their region to address specific forms of hate and empower brothers with the skills to address incidents of hate and bigotry. Beta Alpha Theta Chapter at the University of Colorado at Boulder recently participated in a NCBI workshop led by ZBT's Director of Hate Prevention and Jewish Enrichment, Sheri Rosenberg, and William C. Rader, Iota (University of Denver) 2020. Beta Alpha Theta Chapter President John R. Ochoa (2022) viewed the program as *"an interesting and fun way to get to know (his) brothers. (He) got to know a lot of new things about people that (he) thought (he) knew really well. Thinking about people and their different identities was pretty eye-opening, and (he) would definitely recommend this program to other chapters."*

Most recently, ZBT joined the Combat Anti-Semitism Movement to try to encourage as many people as possible to raise awareness about the rise of anti-Semitism on campus and around the world. Brothers, undergraduate and alumni alike, are able to sign a pledge to combat anti-Semitism and encourage other students, family, friends and community members to sign the pledge as well. 
