Growing our Brotherhood

This has been the first full year of post-pandemic brotherhood on many campuses and for many of our youngest brothers. Today's students are bringing excited energy to recruitment, greeting many potential new brothers and growing the Brotherhood. Some highlights from recruitment include 59 new brothers at the Lambda Chapter at the University of Texas, 66 new brothers at Beta Gamma Chapter at Indiana University and an impressive 88 brothers initiated at Alpha Omicron at the University of Arizona. Many chapters are excited to share why it's great to be a ZBT with new brothers.

We are very proud of the Eta Lambda Chapter at Emory University, who just celebrated its Chartering Ceremony after being re-founded just before the COVID-19 lockdowns. We are very pleased as well to announce that Alpha Omicron at the University of Miami just earned approval for their Charter in an incredible 13 months after the Prospective Chapter was founded last spring.

Zeta Beta Tau is thrilled to launch a highly anticipated re-founding project in the fall at Florida State University. Zeta Alpha will be a great place for new brothers to thrive. We continue to explore some additional growth opportunities as students reach out to ZBT International Headquarters requesting that we bring the world's first Jewish fraternity to their campus.

Overall, the Fraternity continues to expand initiatives and programming in hate prevention and antisemitism awareness. ZBT remains as strongly committed as ever to being a voice for the Jewish people, especially on college campuses. A new staff-led program is called Antisemitism: Past and Present, offering an overview of the history of Jewish persecution. This training reached over 600 ZBTs in 2022. ZBT also continues to work with external partners like Jewish Women International and Hillel International to educate ZBTs and their fellow students. Chapters at the local level are engaging in a variety of activities and educational opportunities that might surprise you with their creativity, though outdoor sports and games, group hikes, retreat weekend bonfires and other fun among Zeebs will forever be beloved among brothers.

The University of Denver Zeta Beta Tau and Phi Sigma Delta merged brotherhood recently achieved an accomplishment that few other chapters have reached – 100 years!

Over the weekend of October 6 to 8, the brothers of Iota Chapter at the University of Denver (DU) hosted their centennial celebration. Iota was founded in 1920; brothers and guests were thrilled to be able to mark this moment in history, finally, after a two-year delay due to the pandemic. Master of Ceremonies was 50-plus year Chapter Advisor and Past International President Stephen P. Ehrlich, Esq., Iota (University of Denver) 1970.

Dozens of brothers and guests helped honor this occasion over a weekend's worth of events, including International President Jonathan D. Frieden, Phi Epsilon (University of Virginia) 1994; Fraternity Chief Executive Officer Libby Anderson, CAE; Zeta Beta Tau Foundation Chief Executive

"The 100th celebration was a huge success. My thanks to Brothers Gary Berz and Don Reisfeld along with the reunion committee," Past International President Ehrlich said.

At the reception, Brother Aidan E. Vaughey, Iota 2023, then-Chapter President, gave a hearty welcome to the alumni and guests. Miofsky from the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life gave an informative overview of Greek Life at DU. Brother Edward (Ned) Porges Ed.D, Iota 1962, reflected on the history of the Chapter house. Brother Porges lived in the facility first in 1959. Iota's oldest alumnus, Brother Dr. Joseph S.

Szyliowicz, Iota 1953, was introduced to the Brotherhood. The celebration included a 100-year Iota logo that was made into a sheet cake and served by Don Reisfeld.

Hello from the University of Denver. My name is Christopher Miofsky and I serve as the Associate Director of Fraternity and Sorority Life (FSL). It is a pleasure to share a few updates with you. Since the beginning of the school year, we continue to work to bring our community back together after the height of the pandemic.

- We have begun a strategic planning process for our community to ensure that we can prove we are living up to our values. I thank Steve Ehrlich for serving on this committee as an alumni representative with extensive institutional knowledge. The plan will be made publicly available once it is finally approved.

- We have also continued to migrate processes online (roster updates, F.O.R.G.E. (formerly known as Accreditation), and others). We look forward to continuing to move more processes online to provide easier access to information for our members. We plan to pilot a council dues payment online beginning the winter quarter.

- We have been able to slightly increase staff capacity within FSL by sharing a Program Coordinator, Allie Tookmanian, with the Office of Student Engagement and two graduate students, Isabel Salvatore and Victoria Pereira who are working on several community wide initiatives related to brotherhood/sisterhood/siblinghood and health & safety.

I want to recognize the generosity of the chapter during its Centennial Celebration. It was wonderful to see so many alums and friends be present to support the chapter on this special occasion. I was humbled to be asked to say a few words during the reception after the hockey game and to be invited to the pre-game happy hour. I am thankful for our long partnership with Zeta Beta Tau and the support you all have given to our campus over our many years of partnership. I wish you all a safe and wonderful holiday season!

ZBT continues to lead the Greek world with its JOURNEY PROGRAM, a non-pledging, non-hazing program for assimilation and education of all brothers.

In 1989 ZBT eliminated pledging as a tradition. While we have had our challenges gaining universal acceptance from all chapters, ZBT is clearly a safer and better brotherhood because of this courageous choice. Other fraternities have now followed our lead.

Scott Levin is the Regional Director of the Anti-Defamation League's Mountain States Region. Scott is a frequent speaker and writer on civil rights issues. He has authored many articles, is regularly interviewed by local media, and has testified on numerous occasions before the Colorado Legislature on issues pertaining to equality, diversity, inclusion and educational opportunities for all.

Scott became the ADL Regional Director in December of 2010, after retiring from 28 years as a successful trial attorney. Scott graduated from George Washington University and the University of Denver College of Law. Prior to becoming part of ADL's professional staff, he was a member of its Board of Directors and the recipient of its 2010 Torch of Liberty Award. Scott has been a member of several non-profit boards, including the Metropolitan State University of Denver Foundation, Rose Community Foundation, the Denver Jewish Day School, JEWISH Colorado, Stepping Stones and Congregation Emanuel.

In the absence of the President, I step into his role. This involves assuming their responsibilities and providing leadership to the chapter, ensuring its continued operation and cohesion.

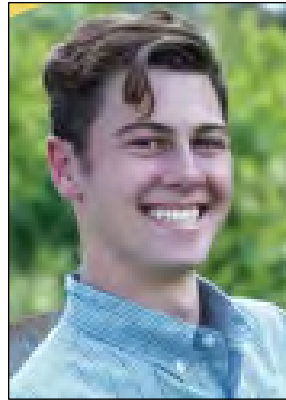
I oversee the Academic Chairman, collaborating closely to support our chapter's academic initiatives and programs. Together, we work towards promoting academic excellence among our members.

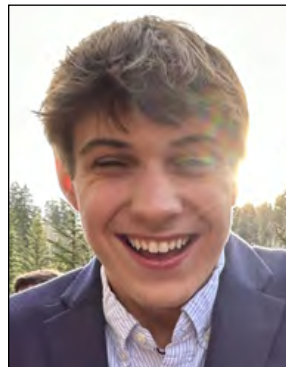
Recruitment Director
