





Fred Karger IOTA '72 World's Greatest Crasher

Operations Director

I actively participate in the transition program at the beginning of each academic term. During this program, I set goals and establish clear expecta-

tions for both me and chair positions to help effectively fill our roles. I regularly attend both Executive Board and Chapter meetings. In participating in smaller meetings to tackle more specialized tasks, I both stay in the loop and can provide general input for growth. Standards Director



The role of the Standards Director in Zeta Beta Tau Fraternity is crucial to ensure that all members uphold the organization's principles and values. The Standards Director is responsible for leading the Standards Board, which is a separate entity from the Executive Board and serves as a chairman. They work closely with other board

members to establish and enforce expectations and Brotherhood Quality Standards. Additionally, the Standards Director is responsible for recognizing brothers who exceed expectations and holding those who violate policies and expectations accountable. The Standards Director plays a significant role in creating a culture of integrity and brotherhood within Zeta Beta Tau Fraternity.

In addition to enforcing standards, the Standards Director collaborates with other members of the Executive Board to ensure the organization's goals and objectives are being met. I attend Executive Board meetings as needed, communicate regularly with the chapter advisor, and work with other board members to conduct the Semiannual Brotherhood Review Vote.
