At this year's Zeta Beta Tau's International Convention and Leadership School held in Denver, Iota Chapter and IOTAs were honored and presented with the following awards.

Marc Nathanson, 1967 was awarded ZBT's Man of Distinction Award

Dan Goodman, 2008 was awarded ZBT's Outstanding Young Alumnus Award

The chapter was honored as the **Runner-up of ZBT's Brummer Cup for Best Chapter**. This is the 9th out of the past 10 years where the chapter has either been the best chapter, twice in the last four years, or runner-up... *"Decade of Dominance"*.

The Chapter won the **Omega Cup** for best publication award for the seventh year in a row – thanks to our editor/publisher Don Reisfeld for a job very well done.

Iota won the award for **Best Recruitment** in a chapter with under 10,000 students. The chapter initiated 42 men, 4% of students at DU are ZBT's. The chapter won for **Best Brotherhood** event – our alumni panel. Iota was runner up for **Best Heritage** event for its work with DU's Butterfly Garden at the Holocaust Memorial Garden. The chapter received recognition for its upcoming 100th anniversary of its founding at DU. President Will Rader accepted the award. Brothers Will Rader and Jackson Spear both accepted their academic scholarships from the ZBT foundation.

Also joining the nearly fifty alumni in attendance were Marc Nathanson, Richard Goodman, Gregg Witt, Michael Kaplan, Stuart Schoenfeld, Dave Hauptman, Bruce Balonick and chapter advisors Scott Adams, Ben Brentin, Ryan Martin, Adam Segall and Steve Ehrlich.

Man of the Year Award

Honoring Brothers who Exemplify the Values of Zeta Beta Tau

Marc B. Nathanson Iota (University of Denver) 1967



Marc Nathanson is one of America's leading communications entrepreneurs, for over 40 years. In 1975, Marc founded and was CEO of Falcon Cable TV, one of the largest multiple cable system operators in the United States, with joint ventures in the United Kingdom, France, Brazil, India, Mexico, and the Philippines. In 1999, he sold Falcon Cable TV and became Vice Chairman of Charter Communications, the nation's second largest cable operator.

Today, Marc is Chairman of Mapleton Investments, a diversified investment holding company, specializing in global real estate investments, including fixed income, private equity and direct investments. He is also the Chairman of Falcon Waterfree Technologies, a global water conservation manufacturer. Marc is Vice Chair of the National Democratic Institute for International Affairs (NDI), and Co-Chair of the Pacific Council on International Policy. He is also on the board of Trine Acquisition Corp. (NYSE-TRNE).

In 2012, Secretary of State, Hillary Clinton, appointed Marc as her representative to the Board of the East-West Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. He was also appointed in 1998 by President William Clinton and confirmed by the Senate as the Chairman of the Broadcasting Board of Governors (BBG), which runs Voice of America, Radio Free Europe and all other non-military international communications of the United States. President George W. Bush asked him to stay as Chairman until his successor was confirmed by the Senate (18 months later).

Marc is on the board of the Aspen Institute, and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. He is on the Advisory Board for the USC Annenberg School, Center on Public Diplomacy and The Center for the Digital Future. He is a member of the International Advisory Council for the U.S. Institute of Peace and the Los Angeles Coalition for the Economy and Jobs. Marc founded and is Chairman Emeritus of the Homeland Security Advisory Council (HSAC) for Los Angeles. He is also a former board member of the Skirball Cultural Center, USC Annenberg School, and the UCLA Anderson School of Management. Marc received his Bachelor's degree from the University of Denver and Master's degree from the University of California, Santa Barbara, where he was a National Science Foundation Fellow. He is a member of YPO Gold. He has received numerous honors and awards including the 2009 Global Green Millennium Award and the 2011 Environmental Media Association (EMA) "Lifetime Achievement Award." He and his wife, Jane received the "Service to the Arts" Award from the Anderson Ranch Art Center in 2014 and the Aspen Institute "Socrates Award" in 2018, and the 2019 "Humanitarian Award" from Cedars-Sinai Hospital and the "Guardians Award" from American friends of Hebrew University (2010). Marc is a member of the ZBT Hall of Fame, the Cable TV Hall of Fame, and "Cable Pioneers". In 1994, INC. Magazine named him "Entrepreneur of the Year." He lives in Los Angeles and Aspen with his wife Jane. They have three children and eight grandchildren.

Daniel M. Goodman grew up in the suburbs of Chicago. He joined ZBT at the University of Illinois in 2001. In 2004, Daniel transferred to the University of Denver. In 2005, Daniel began recruiting like-minded men to join him as he refounded the Iota Colony to bring ZBT back to Denver. He served as Iota's first President and guided its growth to one of the strongest chapters on campus. Daniel was proud to be in attendance at the 2016 International Convention in Atlanta when Iota received its first Brummer Cup since Daniel restarted the Chapter.

Daniel grew up with a love of ZBT. His father and uncle were both ZBT's at Denver in the late 70's. Their stories of brotherhood were endless. One of the greatest days in Daniel's life as a ZBT was in 2010 when he got to stand with his father as they dedicated the Iota Chapter house, the same house his father lived in when he was at the University of Denver. It was an amazing homecoming for Iota.

In 2011, Daniel got the great honor of continuing to serve the ZBT community by accepting the nomination to join the Zeta Beta Tau Foundation Board of Directors.

Daniel and his wife Carrie live in Chicago with their children Anna and Jacob. They all enjoy traveling and finding new adventures. Food brings them together with friends and family often.




